| 12. | Worthing Football Club Management Team Update. Ange ran through the progress on the works that are programmed for completion by the end of March this year to enable us to continue playing in this League. A grant application has been submitted to the Premier League Stadium Fund and this is in hand, but the Club will still have to match fund 30%. At the meeting of 22.8.22, the Committee had agreed the WFCSA "would look to retain the majority of our remaining funds (excluding the £1000 used for operational activities, such as the monthly draw, purchase of awards and so on) for grant proposals relating to the ground grading and league requirements" and to ask the Club to put forward specific proposals. The Club had now received a quote for the Crush barriers and were requesting a contribution (full cost over £9,000.) See Appendix D. Although the original decision by the WFCSA was to use all of the funds in our account except £1000, Sarah raised that as we have taken on the organisation of the away travel, she would feel more comfortable retaining a further £500 (so keep the balance in the Account at a minimum of £1500.) It was agreed that the WFCSDA would contribute £1500 to the cost of the Crush Barriers, leaving around £1,700 in the account. | At the Meeting: Ange proposed that £1,500 be contributed, seconded by Gordon. Proposal for Grant Funding from the WFCSA: Providing Crush Barriers.

Proposed by: Paul Crane on behalf of Worthing Football Club

Summary of the Proposal

Following the promotion of the Men's Team, the WFCSA have identified funding for works required to achieve the Ground Grading standards for Step 2.

The Club have requested that the WFCSA consider contributing to the provision of Crush Barriers to the East Stand which are critical works to increase the capacity of the Ground to the required standard of a minimum of 3000.

Benefits for WFC Supporters in Respect of this Proposal

The crush barriers are being provided for the safety of the supporters.

The increased capacity (which must be achieved by the end of March 2023) is required to enable the Men's team to continue to play in the Vanarama League and to be allowed to enter the play offs.

Quoted Costs of the Proposal

A quotation has been provided for the manufacture of the crush barriers.

Quoted cost for manufacture: £8,112.00, plus VAT

Total including fixing the barriers once manufactured: £9,612.00 excluding VAT

Constraints

- 1. The Quote attached in Appendix A is the lowest of three 'like for like' quotes for the works.
- 2. To be allowed to continue to play in this League the works to increase the capacity of the ground must be completed by 31 March 2023.
- 3. Provision of Crush barriers to the East Stand is essential to achieve the required capacity.

Assumptions

1. WFC will purchase the services required for the crush barriers items (including VAT) but the WFCSA will provide any funding towards the cost excluding VAT.

Next Steps

The WFCSA Committee may consider the amount of contribution to be made.

On completion, WFCSA's funding of the project will be highlighted.

Options of the WFCSA

- To agree to the proposal and commit an agreed sum to the works.
- To agree the proposal in principle, but to request further information.
- To refuse the proposal.
